Rugs and carpets with natural fibers and/or certain dyes may require special treatment. If in doubt, contact a cleaning professional for advice/service.

Remove as much of the stain as possible by blotting with a white paper towel, then neutralize with an ammonia solution (1 tablespoon of clear household ammonia to ½ cup of water). Saturate spot with the ammonia solution using a spray bottle. Do not wet backing. Blot with a white paper towel to remove excess moisture. All solutions for removing blood must be cool.

- Spray four squirts of Crystal Spotter® directed at the spot. Use a blotting motion to work the Crystal Spotter® into the affected area. If spot is being removed, continue applying Crystal Spotter® and blotting with a white paper towel until spot is removed.
- If there is still some stain on the carpet and blotting is not removing it, then moisten the tufts in the stained area with 3% hydrogen peroxide. Let stand for one (1) hour. Blot and repeat until carpet is stain free. Light will cause peroxide to change back to water so no rinsing is necessary. Apply pad of paper towels and weight down with brick.
- Apply Crystal Spotter® and agitate with the Carpet Roamer® Spotting Tool.
